NEXUS RECEIVES CONTINUING AUTHORIZATION STATUS

The Interdisciplinary Exchange for Utah Science (NEXUS) has achieved continuing authorization status! NEXUS, dedicated to fostering collaboration across diverse fields of study, has been at the forefront of promoting interdisciplinary research at the U. Securing continuing authorization is a testament to the NEXUS Center's sustained excellence and impact. This status allows the center to maintain its operations and continue serving as a hub for interdisciplinary collaboration. Capitalizing on NEXUS core programming, resources, and partnerships, four key goals

will guide the next five years: catalyzing VEXUS GOAL connections, democratizing data, investigating interdisciplinary issues, and communicating science to the community. To catalyze connections, NEXUS has developed several working groups, including the Veterans' Economic Well-Being and the Future of Food, aimed at securing new external funding. The promotion of the use of the Wasatch Front Research Data Center has been a key activity in democratizing data. As a way of jump starting the investigation of interdisciplinary

issues, NEXUS awarded several destinations grants to move previously unawarded grant proposals to a more successful resubmission for external funding consideration. One of the ways that NEXUS has facilitated communicating science is to support groups like the Utah Radon Lab's efforts in community outreach.

Interdisciplinary research is increasingly recognized as a key driver of



innovation and problem-solving. As we embark on the next phase of its journey, NEXUS remains dedicated to pushing the boundaries of interdisciplinary research, making valuable contributions to our collective understanding of the world's most pressing challenges.
